This was a follow-up event to the July 8th live streaming of the Congressional Ceremony. Vietnam veterans that had participated in the Angelo State University, West Texas Collection, 'Vietnam: Through the Lens' display project, were invited back to a special tour of the Vietnam War-era EC-47 aircraft and history exhibit at Goodfellow AFB. The university completed the media releases, collected RSVP information, and provided bus transportation for the round trip travel to the air base. Arrangements were also made for other veterans that provided their own transportation to get access to the air base without delay. The Goodfellow AFB Commemorative Partner representatives met all participants at the display location and made welcoming comments prior to the tours. A group photo was taken in front of the EC-47 aircraft display. The Goodfellow AFB CP is preparing a separate After Action Report for this portion of the two-part event.

The university program started at 7:30 pm and included a welcome and opening remarks by The EC-47 History Site CP chairman. Video clips from the July 8, 2015 Congressional Ceremony were projected on a large screen in the Nasworthy Suite to 100 attendees. Immediately following the videos, the CP chairman called forward the Vietnam War-era veterans to be presented lapel pins by CP committee members from these organizations: Angelo State University, West Texas Collection; Heritage Chapter - Freedom Through Vigilance Association; The Military Affairs Committee, San Angelo Chamber of Commerce; Elks Lodge 1880, and The EC-47 History Site. The Mayor of San Angelo attended and presented copies of the project kick-off Commemoration Proclamation he had signed in November 2014. The Mayor is a Vietnam War-era veteran, and the Military Affairs Committee representative presented him a lapel pin as well. Following the lapel pin presentations, the university Vice President of Student Affairs and Enrollment Management made special remarks thanking all the veterans for their courage and service to country. He also praised them for their willingness to share their photos and documents, and to sit for oral history interviews as principal players in the Vietnam: Through the Lens display project. Following his closing comments, all attendees enjoyed finger foods and refreshments in the display area as they reviewed the exhibits and spoke with the veteran participants before the official closing at 9 pm. This was a cost-free event for all attendees. It was a wonderful, successful event. The veterans, their families, the military hosts at Goodfellow AFB, all of the CP committee organization representatives, and the Angelo State University West Texas Collection staff were excited about the warmth and sense of community unity that resulted from these combined events.





Closing Reception for "Vietnam: Through the Lens" Exhibit

The ASU West Texas Collection will host a reception on Friday, Aug. 14, to mark the closing of the "Vietnam: Though the Lens" exhibit that opened last November in the Houston Harte University Center.

The reception will be a two-part program that is open free to the public, and attendees may participate in one or both of the activities.

The first part of the program will begin at 5:30 p.m. when an ASU bus will transport attendees from the University Center to Goodfellow Air Force Base for a 6 p.m. tour of the Airborne Radio Direction Finding (ARDF) History Exhibit and the EC-47 aircraft on static display at the Norma Brown Headquarters Building.

To be eligible to enter Goodfellow AFB for the tour, participants over the age of 16 who do not have a military ID or military-related civilian ID must RSVP in advance to the West Texas Collection (WTC) by Tuesday, Aug. 11. They will be asked to provide their full name, date of birth, and driver's license number and state of issuance. They will then be able to enter the base through the south gate off Chadbourne Street by showing their driver's license or other photo ID at the gate. This process must be completed, regardless of whether they intend to ride the ASU bus or take a private vehicle to the tour location. Drivers of private vehicles must also show proof of insurance.

The second part of the program will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the WTC Gallery on the second floor of the ASU University Center. All Vietnam veterans in attendance will be recognized, and a reception and refreshments will follow. This will be the final opportunity to view the "Vietnam: Through the Lens" exhibit, which includes the photos, documents and other memorabilia of more than 50 local Vietnam veterans.

The closing reception has been recognized as an official event in the national U.S.A. Vietnam War Commemoration initiative, and the WTC and Goodfellow AFB are hosting as members of official Commemorative Partnerships.

While the "Vietnam: Through the Lens" exhibit will close on Aug. 14, WTC staff will continue to conduct interviews and collect photos and memorabilia from interested veterans.

Linda Knightstep and her crew with the Army Nurse Corps were in the path of rebels flooding from Cambodia toward Saigon during the Tet Offensive. Stationed in Cu Chi, Vietnam, Knightstep was at the center of the action in 1968, when for a week straight, from 200 to 300 wounded soldiers were rushed to the nurses' care.

"The scene, you can't begin to imagine — 200 bodies under the sun," Knightstep said. "You're going from man to man to man trying to keep them alive."

Knightstep is one of more than 60 local veterans whose service

memorabilia is part of "Vietnam: Through the Lens," an exhibit put on by the West Texas Collection at Angelo State University. Her boonie hat, medals and letter of commendation are on display for only one more day as the WTC staff prepares for their next display.

Before the exhibit is gone, though, the WTC is hosting a closing reception at 7:30 p.m. Friday in the Houston Harte University Center, 1910 Rosemont Drive. The exhibit opened in November.

Vietnam veterans in attendance will be recognized, and a reception and refreshments will follow. The event has been recognized as an official part of the national U.S.A. Vietnam War Commemoration initiative, and the WTC and Goodfellow Air Force Base are hosting as members of official Commemorative Partnerships, according to an ASU news release.

Last month ASU invited local veterans to campus for a screening of an official U.S. Congressional ceremony thanking and honoring the 7.2 million living Vietnam veterans and the 9 million families of those who served. Attending veterans received a special lapel pin, as will those who are present Friday.

The turnout for "Through the Lens" has been astounding, said WTC Director Suzanne Campbell.

"Family members have been thrilled because they found out more about the people who have served," Campbell said. "It's been a great exhibit. I hate to take it down."

Together with the ASU History Department, the WTC interviewed and collected photos and trinkets from local veterans willing to share their stories. Photos were scanned and digitized, now part of the collection permanently for anyone to peruse — even after the display is taken down. Some of the memorabilia was donated and will also be available for public viewing.

To many veterans, taking part in the exhibit meant a lot, said Shannon Sturm, an archivist with WTC.

"You see the recogni-

tions happening nationwide, but we have veterans locally who need to be recognized," Sturm said.

After the war Vietnam veterans didn't do much talking about it unless they were with other vets, and even then they remain guarded, Knightstep said.

The dozens of veterans she spoke to through the exhibit said it was a healing time for them, Knightstep said. They began to talk about their feelings and how what they experienced changed their lives.

"It opened that secret compartment you keep hidden to yourself and allowed them vent," Knightstep said.

Next up for the WTC is a spread chronicling downtown San Angelo and the role of historic preservation, opening Oct. 13.
