

Former EC-47 Pilot visits Goodfellow

Former USAF Captain and 360th TEWS EC-47 pilot, Jack Bulleit, visited Goodfellow AFB on 13 November to attend the graduation ceremony for his great-nephew, A1C Casey Schaive. Airman Schaive completed the Airborne Intelligence,


Surveillance, and Reconnaissance Operators technical training course. Heritage Chapter - FTVA president, CMSgt retired JJ Graham, works in the school house and tipped us about Jack's pending visit. JJ also organized a visit/briefing/photo shoot at the static display aircraft and the ARDF History Exhibit inside the Norma Brown building. All those available then enjoyed dinner together downtown. It was a special day for sure. Jack was commissioned through the college ROTC program and earned his wings after flight training in February 1968 at Selma AFB, Alabama. He requested the EC-47 program and went on to C-47 training at England AFB, Louisiana, with a follow-on tour to the 360th TEWS at Tan Son Nhut AB. He arrived in country in April 1968. Bulleit flew 201 missions in the EC-47 and accumulated 1,545 hours of flying time. Near the end of his time in the service, he flew C-141 missions until separating from the Air Force in August 1972. Jack lives in Cleveland, Georgia, in the shadow of the Appalachian Mountains. He is proud that his great-nephew will be adding to the legacy of service in the Air Force and in the intelligence mission. Jack spoke highly of the "spooks" he hauled around in the backend of the gooney...even admitting to a few scattered facts about a night or two on the town with the RO's. Tom presented him an EC-47 ARDF History Exhibit challenge coin and invited him back in March 2020 to attend the Vietnam War Veterans Day commemoration pinning ceremony. A new book scheduled for release on January 20, 2020.

About the book: Goodfellow Air Force Base is one of the oldest installations in the US Air Force. It was the first of scores of flying training fields established across Texas and Oklahoma during World War II. Over the next eight decades, nurtured by a special relationship between city and base, Goodfellow distinguished itself by training more than 400,000 pilots, intelligence operators, and firefighters for all the US armed forces. There are 8 chapters of unique photos and captions that chronicle the history of the base from 1940 through 2020. The Arcadia Images of America series is restricted to 128 pages which made the selection of photographs to tell a coherent story even more critical and time consuming. The technical training for the airborne radio direction finding operators, analysts, communicators and maintenance personnel during the Vietnam War was short-lived at Goodfellow, but many readers will relate to the photos of the "X" console, the EC-47 static display aircraft and the ARDF History Exhibit inside the Norma Brown building. Photos of the Ray Leftwich family are representative of all 6994th Security Squadron aircrew members memorialized on Goodfellow. There is also extensive coverage of the NCO Academy that operated on Goodfellow from 1959 through 2008.

About the authors: Dr. 'Doc' John V. Garrett retired as historian at Goodfellow following a 30-year career, earning numerous Air Force-level awards and the history program's award for career contributions. CMSgt Tom Nurre (Ret.) served 33 years, including six at Goodfellow supervising ground training in a mobile squadron and as NCO Academy commandant. To prepare this book, they tapped the vast archive at Goodfellow and other sources in the community.

Doc & Tom are working with a publicist arranging a book release event and marketing plan. Books will become available through usual book-seller outlets and the ec47.com website. The authors are also in contact with local businesses that have expressed an interest. Check ec47.com for updates.

Background Information

Memorials may be as simple as listing the veteran's name, branch and dates of service on the four-line rectangle bronze plate - to adding a meaningful service emblem and additional service-related details on the larger seven-line round bronze plate.

Engraved plates will be installed and dedicated during annual Vietnam War Veterans Day ceremonies held at the wing headquarters flagpole area.

There are two methods for purchasing these pavers.

EC-47 Memorial Pavers Plaza
GOODFELLOW AIR FORCE BASE WING HEADQUARTERS

A Vietnam War replica EC-47 Electric Goon was installed in front of the Goodfellow Norma Brown building on Oct. 28, 2005. It stands in tribute to the intelligence, surveillance and re-connaissance mission that has been the base's training focus since 1958. The EC-47 ARDF History Exhibit was added inside the building on July 25, 2014.

Supported by a grant from The Freedom Through Vigilance Association (FTVA), the local FTVA Heritage Chapter is sponsoring the addition of a memorial pavers plaza next to the aircraft dedication monument.
