This event, co-hosted by the EC-47 History Site and American Legion Post 572, was well publicized through the local TV stations, a county-wide press release, and personal interviews. The local VVA Chapter 457 organized a balloon launch one-half hour prior to the start of the recognition ceremony. About 200 veterans, family members and community guests and the public attended. Chapter 457, along with VFW Post 1815, American Legion Post 572, Angelo State University (ASU) West Texas Collection and History Department as well as the Concho Valley Women Veterans Association displayed Commemoration posters, Fact Sheets and organization information on display tables arranged throughout the LeGrand Center. The Lake View High School JROTC Color Guard presented the U.S. & Texas flags as local Texas Tech graduate Mitchell Gatlin led the pledge of allegiance and played a trumpet solo of the national anthem. The All Veterans Council of Tom Green County Chaplain David Harvatin presented the opening prayer. Tom Nurre, Jr., representing the ASU Office of Communications & Marketing, a commemorative partner program committee member since 2014, was the emcee and presented a narrative about the national flags as ASU Honors Program and West Texas Collection students posted the flags from Australia, New Zealand, Philippines, South Korea, Thailand and the Republic of South Vietnam in front of the ballroom. Following excerpts from Commemoration video's and President Trumps' signing of the latest proclamation, Mayor Brenda Gunter presented and signed a renewed proclamation for the City of San Angelo. Chamber of Commerce representative, Dr. Carol Bonds, and the EC-47 History Site website manager, Joe Martin, presented a Certificate of Honor and appropriate lapel pin to Gold Star and Blue Star family members. This was followed by the playing of a medley of service songs as American Legion Post 572 members posted the military service flags and placed them with the previously posted allied country flags. A highlight of the evening was a presentation by Aryn Lockhart about being rescued from Vietnam as an orphan during Operation Baby Lift in 1975. Ms. Lockhart was then joined by community leaders to honor and present commemorative lapel pins to veterans as they were called forward by name. The Heritage Chapter - Freedom Through Vigilance Association distributed "thank you goodie bags" filled with commemoration provided proclamations, tin pins, stickers, fact sheets, and a chapter Certificate of Honor. The evening concluded with various refreshing drinks, cookies and a specially decorated Vietnam Veterans Day layer cake.
