Most Vietnamese Americans Celebrate the Lunar New Year

Many Asian countries - including China, Korea, Japan and Vietnam – use a lunar calendar in addition to the solar calendar commonly used in the United States, Overall, about two-thirds of Chinese, Korean, Japanese and Vietnamese Americans (68%) celebrate the Lunar New Year, or what is often referred to as the Chinese New Year. Commemoration of the Lunar New Year is highest among Vietnamese Americans (93%) and Chinese Americans (82%) - who are about as likely to celebrate the Lunar New Year as to

celebrate Thanksgiving. Fewer Korean Americans (45%) and Japanese Americans (30%) say they celebrate the Lunar New Year. This excerpt from a 2013 Pew Research paper by Michael Remez is just one of literally thousands of pages of information available online.
